## "Letters From John: Written So That..." - Part 2

1 John 1:5-10



"Walk Exposed To Light"

From the very first day of creation, the presence of God has been identified with the existence of light. Light is the only visible expression of God. Radiating from Him, it is diffused through the universe as the principle of life, and is seen throughout scripture.

**Big Idea:** "because God is light, God's children, therefore, must be those who walk exposed to and reflect that light!"

# The Essence of the Father (1 John 1:5)

"This is the message we have heard from him and declare to you: God is light; in him there is no darkness at all." (1 John 1:5 NIV)

- Light (phos), has no article preceding it, the rule of Greek grammar is that the absence of the definite article shows quality, nature, or essence. In other words, God is not a light, nor the light, but simply and absolutely God is light, in His very nature.
- The double <u>negative</u> in the Greek dispels any misunderstanding we might have concerning the purity of this light, its like saying...God as to His nature is light, and darkness in Him does not exist, not even one bit.

# The Essence of Our Fellowship (1 John 1:6-7)

"<sup>6</sup> If we claim to have fellowship with him yet walk in the darkness, we lie and do not live by the truth. <sup>7</sup> But if we walk in the light, as he is in the light, we have fellowship with one another, and the blood of Jesus, his Son, purifies us from all sin." (1 John 1:5-7 NIV)

- Fellowship (koinōnia) = "to have joint-participation with someone else in things possessed in <u>common</u> by both."
- To <u>continue</u> in a lifestyle of sin and say you fellowship with God, is an oxymoron!
- John revels in the verb, cleanse (purify in the NIV) the <u>constant</u> "Niagara Falls" flow of Christ's blood, as it cascades over his sin, washing it away continually.

#### The Essence of His Forgiveness (1 John 1:8-10)

"<sup>8</sup> If we claim to be without sin, we deceive ourselves and the truth is not in us. <sup>9</sup> If we confess our sins, he is faithful and just and will forgive us our sins and purify us from all unrighteousness. <sup>10</sup> If we claim we have not sinned, we make him out to be a liar and his word has no place in our lives." (1 John 1:8-10 NIV)

- *Confess* = "to say the <u>same</u> thing as another," or, "to agree with another.
- The fellowship we have with the Father is not, nor ever will be, maintainable by <u>our</u> effort. We were not saved by our effort nor does our effort keep us saved. God alone is the hero.

## So What?

Ask yourself...

- 1. Do you find that the majority of your desires are towards God's light (or presence) or away from it?
- 2. If you have trusted Jesus Christ to save you, and desire continual fellowship with Him, but your sin has broken that fellowship, are you ready to confess that sin and receive His forgiveness?
- 3. Do you understand your responsibility to reflect the light of Jesus Christ into the darkness of a world that is lost without Him?

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
