Pillar 1: "Passionate Prayer to God - Part 1"

Jesus said, "It is written, 'My house shall be a house of prayer,' but you have made it a den of robbers." (Luke 19:46 ESV)

Big Idea: "because Jesus Christ commanded His church to be a House of Prayer, we fulfill His command when we pray according to the model he set forth!"

Reverence For God (6:9)

"Our Father in heaven, hallowed be your name," (Matt 6:9 NIV)

- Jesus wants us to forget our circumstances for a minute and focus <u>heavenward</u>
- We see that the name, *onoma*, of God, or His <u>authority</u>, His <u>characteristics</u> and <u>attributes</u>, are *hagiazo* or <u>set</u> <u>apart</u> from all the rest.

Response To God (6:10)

"Your kingdom come, your will be done on earth as it is in heaven." (Matt 6:10 NIV)

- Knowing who God is demands an active response from those who say they know Him. The right response is <u>submission</u>. It is God's <u>people</u>, doing God's <u>work</u>, God's <u>way</u>!
- Doing the will of God is to be our <u>only</u> priority, not just one on a list of priorities!

Request From God (6:11-12)

"Give us today our daily bread.

Forgive us our debts, as we also have forgiven our debtors." (Matt 6:11-12 NIV)

- Supplication asking God to give us our <u>needs</u>, <u>when</u> we need them.
- Confession a prayer to <u>restore</u> our fellowship with the Father when this fellowship has been <u>hindered</u> by the sins of our flesh.

Ready With God (6:13)

"And lead us not into temptation, but deliver us from the evil one." (Matt 6:13 NIV)

• Jesus instructs us to ask for God's <u>guidance</u> as we launch out into our day so that we can remain <u>pure</u>.

So What?

Would it be worth praying if God never answered our prayers according the answer we desired? Yes, because the only enduring motive for prayer is that *God is worthy to be sought*!
