In this morning's passage, Paul describes for us the means of accountability that he used to assure godly integrity with regard to money.

Big Idea: "since God has called us to generosity, we are responsible to handle these funds with focused integrity"

Smitten in the Heart (8:16-17)

"I thank God, who put into the heart of Titus the same concern I have for you. For Titus not only welcomed our appeal, but he is coming to you with much enthusiasm and on his own initiative." (2 Cor 8:16-17 NIV)

- Paul says that Titus' heart literally "is being smitten" by God.
- When God has our hearts, there is unity of <u>direction</u> and <u>purpose</u>, and spirit motivated enthusiasm for ministry.

Renowned in the Word (8:18-19)

"And we are sending along with him the brother who is praised by all the churches for his service to the gospel. What is more, he was chosen by the churches to accompany us as we carry the offering, which we administer in order to honor the Lord himself and to show our eagerness to help." (2 Corinthians 8:18-19 NIV)

- This brother, whose name is not given, is credentialed only by his <u>preaching</u> of the <u>gospel</u>.
- God's <u>Word</u> and God's <u>Wisdom</u> are one and the same.
