 In Acts 18:1-17, Paul upon arriving in Corinth, met Aquila and his wife Priscilla, Jews who had been driven out of Rome, and were like himself, Paul stayed with them and preached regularly in the synagogue every Sabbath. Paul ministered in Corinth for 1-½ years, establishing a solid church in the midst of this depraved culture, and left the care of the church in the hands of Some time later, Paul received reports while at Ephesus on his missionary journey, that factions, quarreling, and unspiritual divisions had developed. Paul writes to set these issues straight and deal with other church problems.

Splits and Quarrels in the Church (1:10-17)

"I appeal to you, brothers, in the name of our Lord Jesus Christ, that all of you agree with one another so that there may be no divisions among you and that you may be perfectly united in mind and thought... What I mean is this: One of you says, "I follow Paul"; another, "I follow Apollos"; another, "I follow Cephas'"; still another, "I follow Christ." ...For Christ did not send me to baptize, but to preach the gospel—not with words of human wisdom, lest the cross of Christ be emptied of its power." (1 Corinthians 1:10-17 NIV)

Paul in essence is saying, "My purpose is to preach the gospel of Christ, not to make a name for myself, and therefore, I will do nothing that will cause the preaching of the cross of Christ to be emptied of its power!"
