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Application/Study Questions:

- 1. What is the significance of the "therefore" in v. 12? How is v. 12 related to the previous section on God's discipline? Is it possible to become weary, weak, discouraged and fainthearted in this life? What are we required to do so that we don't quit the race of faith in Jesus Christ? (v. 14) Practically how do we do this?
- 2. Oftentimes, Christians misunderstand the doctrine of perseverance. They say that "once saved always saved" means that there is no effort required on my part to live the Christian life. However, notice the action verbs and what is required of us in v. 14? What does it mean to "strive for peace with everyone?" Because we often think too highly of ourselves we make demands of others. What might this verse teach us about "putting others before ourselves?"
- 3. What does it mean to strive for "holiness without which no one will see the Lord?" The writer seems to be telling us that holiness is an inevitable characteristic in the Christian life and if there is no holiness we will not inherit heaven. How do you reconcile this with being "saved by grace" and not by works? Read Philippians 2:12-13. How does striving for holiness and working out our salvation go together?
- 4. What are the four dangers that the writer lists for us that might disqualify us from the race of faith? Review each of them and evaluate whether or not these dangers have infiltrated your life. - 5. What does it mean to fall short of the grace of God?
- 6. Is there any (hidden) root of bitterness in your life toward God concerning any trials that you have had to endure?
- 7. Is there any "hint of sexual immorality" in your life that you need to rid yourself? (See Eph 5:3)

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
