"Spiritually Clueless"

Up to this point, the disciples have heard Jesus' teaching, His claims of deity- being verified by miracles like healing the sick, casting out demons, calming the storm, raising the dead, empowering the disciples to preach, and feeding up to 20,000 people with 5 loaves and 2 fishes. You would have thought that they were at a point of complete trust and faith in Him.

Big Idea: "...because Jesus Christ is the glorious, infinite God, we must walk daily knowing that life's storms are allowed by Him and that deliverance comes through Him!"

His Command (6:45-46)

"⁴⁵ Immediately Jesus made his disciples get into the boat and go on ahead of him to Bethsaida, while he dismissed the crowd. ⁴⁶ After leaving them, he went up on a mountainside to pray." (Mark 6:45-46 NIV)

- Luke tells us, "16 But he would withdraw to desolate places and pray" (Luke 5:16 ESV), as if it were a normal occurrence.
- If God-in-the-flesh thought prayer was essential to every aspect of His ministry, so should we!

His Coming (6:47-50a)

"⁴⁷ When evening came, the boat was in the middle of the lake, and he was alone on land. ⁴⁸ He saw the disciples straining at the oars, because the wind was against them. About the fourth watch of the night he went out to them, walking on the lake. He was about to pass by them, ⁴⁹ but when they saw him walking on the lake, they thought he was a ghost. They cried out, ⁵⁰ because they all saw him and were terrified." (Mark 6:47-50 NIV)

- Jesus here shows He is sovereign God, Master over the fierceness of the sea and <u>savior</u> of all those who are under its influence!
- The Son of God, used this opportunity to display His glory to His storm drenched disciples, wanting them to recognize that only in Him could they be rescued.

His Comfort (6:50b-52)

"⁵⁰ Immediately he spoke to them and said, "Take courage! It is I. Don't be afraid." ⁵¹ Then he climbed into the boat with them, and the wind died down. They were completely amazed, ⁵² for they had not understood about the loaves; their hearts were hardened." (Mark 6:50-52 NIV)

- Exposure to the glory of God to those in close proximity must be followed up by words of comfort and <u>reassurance</u>.
- It is time to stop our "spiritual cluelessness" and get on our face before the one who causes great men to fear and all creation to flee!

His Compassion (6:53-56)

"53 When they had crossed over, they landed at Gennesaret and anchored there. 54 As soon as they got out of the boat, people recognized Jesus. 55 They ran throughout that whole region and carried the sick on mats to wherever they heard he was. 56 And wherever he went—into villages, towns or countryside—they placed the sick in the marketplaces. They begged him to let them touch even the edge of his cloak, and all who touched him were healed." (Mark 6:53-56 NIV)
