**Prayer Time:** The Elders prayed together and focused on the current needs of the congregation.

#### **Approval of Minutes**

A motion was made to approve the minutes from the Elders Meeting held July 16, 2018, it was seconded and passed.

#### Financial Report - July 2018 (Attachment# 1)

The motion was made to approve this financial report, it was seconded and passed unanimously. Byron Roth was absent but the elders discussed the following

• To date, we are doing well and only \$4500 below our income budget, but expenses are also below budget.

#### **Discussion Items:**

- 1) Semi-Annual Meeting Debrief
  - Question by a congregant resulting from how the pastoral gift was presented to the congregation.
  - Pat Barry will explain more fully in the next congregational meeting
- 2) Fork Township Church Plant (Swannie Griffin)
  - Tim Zuck needs \$30,000 to renovate a place where they will be renting and moving into (former childcare facility)
  - Mission Committee has committed \$5,000 (from Faith Promise), and is requesting
    the elder board to approve a \$5,000 match. Motion made that the elder board
    approve a matching \$5,000 to the Mission Committee's \$5,000 pending Dave
    Gundrum's approval, seconded and passed unanimously.
- 3) Rachel Marks Leaving, and Replacement Proposal (Dick Bickings) (Attachment 2)
  - Rachel Marks announced to the PRC that she will be stepping down from her responsibilities as Office Assistant and Kids Crossing Coordinator to take on the responsibilities of a stay-at-home mom. Therefore, a proposal for two new positions was given to the elders (Attachment #2).
  - As a result, the Elder's made a motion to receive the proposals, to hire an Office
     Assistant and a Children's Ministry Director as per the associated job descriptions,
     seconded and passed unanimously.
  - Elders asked that the jobs be posted for 2 weeks internally. [Note: after this elders meeting, an appeal was made to the elders (Attachment #3) to allow these positions to be handpicked and not posted, and the elders agreed.]

- 4) Foyer Renovations
  - Elders made a **motion** for the property committee to explore ways of renovating the foyer, **seconded** and **passed unanimously.**
- 5) Parsonage Usage
  - Elders made a motion to have the Property Committee sell the parsonage, seconded and passed unanimously.

Phil Norris adjourned the meeting with prayer.

#### **Purpose:**

- Provide a quality Children's Ministry at Ebenezer Bible Fellowship Church for children grade 5 and younger that teaches the Gospel message and biblical discipleship principals in engaging, age-appropriate ways.
- Recruit volunteers to fill all needed positions and equip them to fulfill their rolls including training, encouragement, support, etc
- Reports directly to the Pastor of Discipleship

#### Responsibilities:

- Lead Volunteer Recruitment/Training/Encouragement
- Oversee Cross Time Sunday School classes and teach or fill-in when necessary
- Oversee Children's Church and teach or fill-in when necessary
- Oversee Awana clubs and participate as necessary
- Oversee VBS program and participate as necessary
- Lead Trip to Summer Camp Week, driving van or finding drivers for drop-off/pick-up daily
- Lead Trip to Winter Retreat Weekend, driving van or finding drivers, and counseling
- Actively Upkeep Resource Room keeping it clean/organized/stocked
- Create a welcoming environment for Children, Parents, and Volunteers
- Maintain Background Checks, Photo ID Badges, Safety & Security Procedures/Policies
- Attendance Tracking of all Children's Ministry events
- Maintain Children's Ministry Database
- Promote programs & events
- Update Kids Crossing Facebook Page, web page, web calendar, brochures, literature rack
- Email Parents & Volunteers weekly (or as needed) with appropriate updates & reminders
- Curriculum: Order as needed. Prepare it for teachers & students by posting electronic files where needed and storing paper copies where needed. Constantly evaluate current and prospective curriculum for effectiveness.
- Attend Staff Meetings (2x/month)
- Fulfill additional responsibilities as seen necessary by the pastors and elders

Hey Dear Brothers.

Thank you so much for approving the two job proposals Monday night at our elder's meeting and as a result I hope to fill these positions by the beginning of October. But before I proceed, I wanted to get your wisdom on the following,,,

I know we discussed the reason behind posting them internally for two weeks, however, I would like to appeal that requirement, and would like to offer the positions to the candidates listed on the first page for the following reasons:

- There is no requirement to post these positions by any external law nor is there any requirement stated in own internal Employee Handbook, By-laws, or BFC denomination (see email PDF below from Dave Allen). - 2. Because of the importance of maintaining the privacy of sensitive information that circulates through the office with respect to the congregation as a whole, along with the more specific children's ministry clearance laws, we need people who are already involved serving in these ministries, and are active members with proven records that have been tested over time.
- 3. Because of the need to hit-the-ground-running in both areas of ministry, the necessity of minimal training is the most desirable. Both candidates listed are already veterans in the areas stated.
- 4. Our desire is to hire people who would be serving as volunteers whether or not the positions were available, and doing so because they desire to serve the body for the glory of God, not just because they are getting paid. I believe that both fit that description.

So there it is brothers, I will abide by and submit to the ruling of the elders, however, I would ask you to prayerfully consider my request.

**Studying & Preaching:** We are moving right along in the Gospel of John on Sunday mornings. It is exciting to study this Gospel verse by verse. I truly am convinced that expository preaching is the way God intended His Word to be preached. Each week we are building upon what we have already studied. My prayer is that the Holy Spirit continues to work in our hearts and minds as His Word comes alive to us.

I am also teaching through the book of James on Wednesday night. This book provides a series of tests to evaluate whether faith is authentic or spurious. It is a practical book on Christian living and the works that should come along with our faith. We continue to have a small group each Wednesday night around 25-30. This is one of my favorite nights of fellowship around singing, the study of the Word and prayer.

<u>Counseling/Visitation:</u> I continue to provide counseling each week to those in need. I am averaging about 2-3 sessions each week. Marriage counseling seems to be the majority of the need. I also continue to reach out to those hurting in the hospitals.

**Upcoming Events**: In addition to my normal activities, I will be preparing for the following events.

- <u>Marriage retreat</u>: I'm excited to be speaking at a marriage retreat in September for Keith Strunk's Church in Hellertown. I am preparing three lessons: Christ honoring communication, Intimacy Interrupted, & Power Struggles in Parenting. I am hoping that there will be room for about 10 couples from our church to attend.
- Quakertown Conference on Reformed Theology: I am honored to be a speaker at this year's conference in Quakertown. The theme of the conference is "The Glory of the Cross." I was asked to be a breakout session speaker. My topic is "What ever happened to Hell?" I will be showing that the glory of the cross is salvation from an eternal damnation in a real Hell. I will interact with contemporary thought & false views of hell and present the biblical view of hell.
- <u>BFC convention</u>: The theme of this year's convention is "Expository Preaching." I will be the opening speaker giving a clear definition of expository preaching. I am on the committee that organized this conference.

**TLT/Church Planting**: I continue to serve on two TLT Church planting teams for Forks & Naples, FL. It is a joy to help and encourage the both Tim Zuck and Jason Filbert each quarter with prayer and support.

**Ebenezer Ministry**: As I look back over the last few months, I am encouraged to see Ebenezer growing spiritually. This is hard to measure, but I see a love for the Word and an excitement in attendance. I see people sharing their faith on a regular basis. I see and hear stories of people's lives being changed. I praise the Lord for continuing to work in our lives.

**Leadership Development**: I am currently encouraging a few men to consider Deaconship & Eldership. As the head of the nominating committee we are always in search of new men whom God has called into ministry. This of course involves training which I am overseeing.

I continue to pray that the Lord would be pleased with the ministry here at Ebenezer. I continue to exhort our staff to be excellent in all they do. I am looking forward to the Fall, and excited to see what the Lord is going to do among us.

## Pastor of Discipleship Report, Jul/Aug 2018

In continuing my trek through the Old Testament, I currently am in the book of Exodus, and recently read this:

"Then he took the Book of the Covenant and read it in the hearing of the people. And they said, "All that the Lord has spoken we will do, and we will be obedient." And Moses took the blood and threw it on the people and said, "Behold the blood of the covenant that the Lord has made with you in accordance with all these words."" (Exodus 24:7–8, ESV)

Here we read that as Moses read God's covenant to the people, they responded with a hearty amen and agreed they would follow his commands. At that point, Moses took blood and sprinkled it on the people as the "blood of the covenant" which put that covenant into effect, and signified cleansing from sin so that the people might enter the covenant relationship with God.

This to me showed how the Holy God seeks a relationship with unholy people and provides them with a blood atonement substitute in order to do so. Ultimately, this points to our savior Jesus Christ who fulfilled this symbolism at the Last Supper when He offered the cup and said, "This is my blood of the covenant, which is poured out for many for the forgiveness of sins" (Matt 26:28).

With that in mind, here are some of the ministry updates from July/August 2018:

#### **Kids Crossing**

- Victory Valley Day Camp (Aug 6-10): 11 of our children attended the day camp filled with exciting activities such as paddle boats, hiking, archery, swimming, roller skating, ropes & challenge courses, crafts, campfires, and Bible lessons. They were excited and greatly blessed by this event.

#### Ministry Reflections:

What a wonderful blessing it has been to see God working in these ways that I am certain His hand of provision continues to go before us. As we reflect upon God's goodness I can't help but thank Him for this incredible summer. Colossians was the book we studied while in Consuelo, DR. The one verse that stood out to me throughout the week was Colossians 3:12 "Therefore as God's chosen ones, holy and dearly loved put on compassion, kindness, humility, gentleness, and patience, bearing with one another and forgiving one another if anyone has a grievance against another. Just has the Lord has forgiven you, you are also to forgive. The verse before this passage says that God is not limited to Greek and Jew, circumcised and uncircumcised, barbarian, Scythian, slave and free, but that Christ is all and in all. We are to be bearers of the light of Christ as we "put on" these attributes of God in our daily attitude. A true disciple of Christ must be working out these characteristics and continuing to grow in these qualities or their is a serious concern on the foundation in which the salvation truly stands. The Holy Spirit's presence was easily recognized in the DR. And while the Spirit is present and active here it is harder to recognize in the midst of all the distractions. It is easy to depend upon ourselves and what we're entitled to and holding things against one another, whereas in 3rd world culture reliance upon God is manifest in basic needs being met and how God provides in spite of circumstances for His glory to be clearly manifested.

#### **MUSIC**

This year I had the joy of doing two different worship workshops with the local worship team at Mt. Zion church in Consuelo. We talked about lyrics of songs that applied to walking by faith and not by site, we talked about vertical and horizontal worship and the differences. The most important element was the testimonies of God's direction in the lives of those in attendance as they learned to trust Him in the midst of very difficult circumstances. Some examples of these difficulties were a house that burnt to the ground, the loss of a dearly loved brother and asking God "why", to being held at gun point. In the midst of all circumstances God's faithfulness was recognized in tragedy, loss, protection, and joy. I don't think we fully understand joy until we have been through the fire. I am challenged in my own heart to truly be open and dependent upon God when I have so many things around me that I can easily depend upon. I must exercise Spiritual disciplines to be obedient to the ever present power of God working. How about us? How are we testifying of God's power in the midst of our weakness? I think we have much to learn from our brothers and sisters all over the world.
