

Studying & Preaching: It is still the joy of my heart to study and preach God's Word. The book of Hebrews has been such a rewarding study as the Lord is revealing to us the great doctrine of the atonement and the work of Christ's superior ministry.

LEAD Men's Leadership Training: We have begun to read and review Biblical Eldership by Alexander Strauch. It is an excellent book on the basics of Eldership. We still have a good group of men attending around 25-30. There are many men in the group are very promising and may be leaders being raised up by the Holy Spirit. We only have 2-3 sessions left.

Worship Ministries: (From Jennie Flicker)

The plans for our Easter services are just about complete. There are many details, but they are coming together. We will have a few extra people join the choir for Easter Sunday morning. <u>Wednesday Night Bible Study/Prayer Meeting</u>: Attendance is up on Wednesday night. Our study of Matthew is rich and our prayer time is wonderful. All Bible studies are posted on the Church website.

We were incredibly blessed to hear messages from Al Mohler (Jn 14:6), John Piper (Romans 9), John MacArthur (John 6), David Platt, Ligon Duncan (Num 5:1-5), Matt Chandler, & Kevin DeYoung. My heart was incredibly blessed and refreshed. The theme of the conference was "Unashamed."

I love being one of the pastors of Ebenezer Bible Fellowship Church. My heart is overjoyed with being able to disciple individuals. I am thrilled to preach the Word of God each and every week and love to see the Saints edified and growing. Overall, I feel like the Church is growing and is healthy. POD (Pastor of Discipleship) Report – Mar/Apr 2014

I recently encountered a difficult situation where my wife and I had to confront a family member over sin. As we dialogued with this family member, it was evident that they had become desensitized by the culture around them. As I pondered this, the following scripture came to mind regarding the good king Josiah...

"Then Shaphan the secretary told the king, "Hilkiah the priest has given me a book." And Shaphan read it before the king. When the king heard the words of the Book of the Law, he tore his clothes. And the king commanded Hilkiah the priest, and Ahikam the son of Shaphan, and Achbor the son of Micaiah, and Shaphan the secretary, and Asaiah the king's servant, saying, "Go, inquire of the Lord for me, and for the people, and for all Judah, concerning the words of this book that has been found. For great is the wrath of the Lord that is kindled against us, because our fathers have not obeyed the words of this book, to do according to all that is written concerning us."" (2 Kings 22:10–13, ESV)

Josiah, was a good king and had a heart for God and was in the process of rebuilding the temple which his predecessors had allowed to fall into ruins. However, even in his zeal for God, had did not know how far he and his people had fallen until he heard the standard, the Book of the Law.

There it was, the standard, as we encounter the culture and it begins to morph us into its likeness, it is the Word of God that brings us back to the likeness of Christ! "Oh, Lord, please do not let me become desensitized to our sinful culture, but always come back to the standard of your Word, Amen."

Kids Crossing

WE are very excited to be able to come along side of them in this very important area. Please pray for a great response for this day. We have 3 wonderful ladies planning on sharing testimonies and music and then the shower aspect. Should be a wonderful morning.

Summer Study will begin on June 19th and will run through the end of July. I am partnering with More of Him Ministries to help promote this study.
