

Board of Elders Meeting May 9, 2016

Roll Call & Prayer

- The following elders were present: Pat Barry, Wayne Batten, Dick Bickings, Andy Brimer, Mark Culton, Dennis Flanagan, Tim Gibson, Swannie Griffin, Kevin Hardy, Jeremy Harkins, Chris Jones, Byron Roth and Shawn Sommons.
- Scott Holwick was excused absent.
- Pastor Dick shared a devotional from **Ecclesiastes 9:18-10:1**. When it comes to fighting sin wisdom is an indispensable weapon. We are all in a battle against sin, and we can never let up or give up. Even a small secret sin can compromise our integrity and ruin us. We need to repent often and forsake our sins. Our sins hurt us as well as our families and the church that we shepherd. This is also a reason to do church discipline dead flies floating around in the perfume will affect the entire batch. **Hebrews 12:4** we need to resist sin no matter what the cost! **Galatians 6:7-10** We will reap what we sow.
- The elders split up into pairs and spent time in prayer.

Approval of Minutes

Motion was made to approve the minutes from the April 11, 2016 elders meeting, **seconded** and **passed**.

Financial Report

Andy reviewed the financial report (*Attachment 1*). Giving from April was a little higher than budgeted and so we made up some ground this past month. However, our spending was also a little higher than budgeted. We are still behind a bit. Andy made a **motion** that we receive the report. This was **seconded** and **passed**.

Discussion Items

- 1) <u>Facility Usage Policy</u> The deacons will continue reviewing the facility usage policy. Once final changes are made, Wayne will have Robbin email the complete document to the elder board before next elders' meeting so that it can be reviewed and voted on at the next elders' meeting.
- 2) Recap from T4G Pastor Jeremy shared with us some of the take-aways from the conference. Mark Dever's sermon was of special benefit to our elder board and our discussions on spiritual measurements. Dever preached on slow reformation within the church. Sometimes we try to move fast and furious and this can be unhealthy at times. Shepherding takes patience and reliance on God. Dever shared about **2 types** of **joys**:

- o **Spotlight joys** often we are using numbers as measuring sticks and they can easily lie. We look at these spotlight moments (quick church growth, a popular, gifted pastor, etc...) and we judge everything by these joys. We need to be really careful about judging the health of our church by spotlight joys.
- o **Elder chair joys** everything is in God's control; there needs to be a spirit of humility when it comes to our vision and goals. Are we joyous over conversions? We need to remember that the weight of the world is on God's shoulders and not ours. We should focus on the joys of seeing lives changed.
- 3) <u>Prayer Committee</u> Pastor Tim recommended the addition of a prayer committee. This would be a great way to emphasize prayer. The committee will be chaired by Pastor Tim and will include Pastor Mark. Mike and Karen Coldren will be an integral part of this endeavor. A **motion** was made to approve this committee. This was **seconded** and **approved** unanimously.
- 4) Membership and Discipline Pastor Dick updated the elders on a discipline situation that we have been working through with a couple in the process of divorce. We had much discussion and prayer about what the discipline looks like. A **motion** was made to remove both husband and wife from church membership for the reason of an unbiblical divorce as a part of the church discipline process. We will be prayerfully considering how to follow Matthew 18 and "tell it to the church." Pastor Tim will also touch base with the pastor where this couple is now worshipping. This motion was **seconded** and passed **unanimously**.
- 5) <u>Elder Board Ground Rules</u> Pastor Tim shared with us a list of ground rules (*Attachment 2*) which we should operate by as an elder board. We discussed these practices and plan to review these periodically to evaluate our health as an elder board.





2016 Income vs Expenses





2016 Income vs Budget

Elder Board Ground-Rules:

Along with the activities and qualifications of 1 Timothy 3, this list is the "pirate code" or ground-rules regarding the practical side of being a team member on an effective Elder Board:

- Elders should speak as one voice. There should be no dissenting voices outside of a meeting in the public eye. This is in order to present a united and stable leadership to the church. Once a decision is made, every elder stands with and supports the team.
- Elders should not be willing to deal with complaints without a name attached. No anonymous issues. If someone is unwilling to put their name behind an issue, it's generally a shameful and/or fruitless discussion.
- Elders should have no "backroom deals." In other words, there should be no private meetings to leverage power over the rest of the elder board.
- Elders who have personal issues between another pastor or elder should get it resolved outside of the meeting and never in a meeting unless the process of Matthew 18 brings it to that point.
- Elders should strive to listen well as their fellow elders share thoughts. Remember James 1:19-20.
- Elders will not come with an issue having rallied other people in the congregation to their side: Come with individual issues. The issue should stand on its merit, not the support an elder garners.
- Individual Elders will not make a commitment on behalf of the elder board. Elders move as a team.
- Elders will always publicly defend and support the other staff and elders, or remain silent. If there is a
 true issue that cannot be resolved through Matthew 18 regarding the staff, all staff issues will be
 brought to the Senior Pastor and/or PRC.
- Elders must commit that the elders meeting shouldn't be the time you hear about a <u>major</u> issue for the first time. Get addenda issues turned in prior to the meeting so that the other elders can think, pray, and prepare for the agenda ahead of time. There are always unique situations, but the unique should not become the norm.
- Elders do not direct the staff in regards to their activities. No one can serve two masters. Directions for the staff come through the Senior Pastor & the PRC.
- Elders have no individual power; they have collective power to move and rule as a team.
- Elders should hold each other accountable to accomplish the commitments they accept.
- Elder meeting attendance is not optional. Elders must be present at 3/4's of the meetings or whatever number is decided upon.
- Elders should strive for a unanimous vote, meaning that we agree ahead of time on the means and manner of moving forward when there are dissenting votes.
- Elders must complete the budget by... September or November.
- Elders should spell out the process of budget creation and include staff in its preparation.
- Elders will be accountable.
- Elders will come prepared to meetings.
- Elders are not just a decision-making body. They are seen as ministering pastors and are expected to shepherd the flock entrusted to them.
- The secretary of the elder board will create and email an action item list from elder meetings to all of the elders.
- Elders will discuss sensitive material and must hold sensitive information in strict confidence.

Pastor of Discipleship Report, Apr/May 2016

As I continue in my trek through the Old Testament, my next stop was the book of Ecclesiastes. Here's what I read this morning:

"Wisdom is better than weapons of war, but one sinner destroys much good.

Dead flies make the perfumer's ointment give off a stench; so a little folly outweighs wisdom and honor." (Ecclesiastes 9:18–10:1 ESV)

As I read this, I was reminded of how important our battle against sin is; all sin. Not just the outward inyour-face type sins but the small, secret, nobody-sees type sins. There is never a time that I can let down my arms and rest. The battle is worth fighting; sin is worth defeating; holiness is worth perusing. If we don't believe this, lets remember the following people of scripture whose small-sin failures affected more then just themselves:

- The sin of Achan (Joshua 7:10-26)
- Sexual immorality defiles the church (1 Corinthians 5)

Finally, when we think we can't go on in our battle against sin, remember these two scriptures:

"In your struggle against sin you have not yet resisted to the point of shedding your blood." (Hebrews 12:4 ESV)

"Do not be deceived: God is not mocked, for whatever one sows, that will he also reap. For the one who sows to his own flesh will from the flesh reap corruption, but the one who sows to the Spirit will from the Spirit reap eternal life. And let us not grow weary of doing good, for in due season we will reap, if we do not give up." (Galatians 6:7–10 ESV)

With that in mind, here is a quick summary of some of the ministry opportunities from April/May 2016:

Kids Crossing

- Cross Time Sunday School (10:05 AM): Praise the Lord that he has provided a complete roster of teachers and helpers. We are currently teaching through the book of Judges.
- Early Childhood (2&3 year-olds): We currently have an opening for a teacher and helper for the 8:45 AM service for the even months. Please pray that the Lord will raise up a team so we do not have to turn people away on Sunday mornings. Praise the Lord, Debbie Flanagan has agreed to take the Early Childhood coordinator position, replacing Anne Christiansen who stepped down at the end of April.
- Children's Church: The Gospel Project curriculum worship segment continues to work well for Children's Church. We continue to see between 8-12 students each week. Please pray that the Lord will raise up a couple to fill in our currently empty team (D) slot. In the interim we are on a 3 team rotation to facilitate the need.
- New Security Check-in: The new check-in system continues to work well, for both Sunday morning Cross Time classes, and Wednesday night Awana. We continue to have trouble with the performance, availability, and capacity of the BCS iPad mini's we are borrowing. The plan is to eventually acquire our own so we can secure them, exclusively use them, keep them clean, and free of unnecessary applications. Please pray for this as I have received a great refurbished, non-profit discount of \$1700 for 6 iPads Air 2. We will at that time install all safety policies and procedures on them for the teachers to reference quickly incase of an emergency.
- Wednesday Evening Programs: Our Awana program is winding down for the 2015/2016 season. We had a great time of fun and fellowship at the Pinewood Derby on 5/4 (more then 50 racers competed), and will be closing our Awana year with our awards night on 5/11. It has been a

fabulous year of fun, bible teaching, and bible memorization. Please pray that the Lord raises up the necessary leaders for the 2016/2017 season.

- New PA Background Check Requirements for Employees & Volunteers: There are still a
 couple of volunteers who have not completed the Mandatory Reporter Training, though not required
 to serve.
- VBS 2016 (June 20-24): We are very excited about this year's VBS, called, "Submerged". As kids submerge themselves in God's Word, they will discover that Jesus didn't just see what's on the outside of people. He looked deep down on the inside. They will learn about Zacchaeus, the Women at the Well, Nicodemus, a blind man, and the children of Jesus day. They will learn new worship songs, and hear from a different missionary everyday, as well as, be involved in a mission project (Operation Christmas Child).

Praise the Lord, we have all our coordinators in place who are diligently working in their areas of responsibility. Please pray for every child who will attended and every volunteer who will help that the Holy Spirit would work mightily to bring about salvation, and growth in the lives of the children that have been entrusted to us.
