

### **Opening & Prayer**

Senior Pastor Tim Gibson opened the meeting and prayed.

### Roll Call

The following elders were present: Dick Bickings, Andy Brimer, Mark Culton, Tim Gibson, Byron Roth, Shawn Sommons. Wayne Batten and Scott Holwick were excused absent.

### **Devotion & Prayer**

Pastor Tim led the elders in a devotional from 1 Samuel 3. Eli accepted the sovereignty of God even when it was very difficult for him. We must also learn to love God's sovereignty - through the good and the bad.

### **Approval of Minutes**

**Motion** was made to approve the minutes from the April 14, 2014 Board of Elders meeting, **seconded** and **passed**.

### **Financial Report**

Andy Brimer reviewed the financial report (Attachment 1). Income is right where it should be and spending is slightly over where it should be. We should remain vigilant in how we spend. A **motion** was made to approve it. This was **seconded** and **passed**.

### **Discussion Items:**

- 1) **Semi-Annual Meeting –** The elders voted to approve the semi-annual meeting being held on July 13, 2014 during the adult elective hour. The motion was **seconded** and **passed**.
- 2) Bible Bee Andy Brimer encouraged the elders to promote the Bible Bee among the congregation. Andy also proposed the following: A non-expense account be set-up under Discipleship Ministries for the purpose of receiving monies that have been donated to the Shelby Kennedy Foundation in support of the local contest of the National Bible Bee for 2014. The funds will be distributed to Peggy Brimer, and someone other than Andrew Brimer will approve the disbursement of funds on a regular basis such that the account will not have any remaining funds past December 31, 2014. Motion was made, seconded and passed with Andy Brimer abstaining.
- 3) **Service Streaming Update** Work continues to be done in preparing for the ability to live-stream the morning worship service. A soft launch in the fall is being planned.

### 4) BFC Annual Conference Update -

- Both newly revised Articles of Faith passed at second reading *The Kingdom of God* (Article 27) and *The Lord's Day* (Article 21).
- There was an update about the painful process over the last year with the York Bible Fellowship Church.
- The study committee on Human Sexuality shared their work and it went back for more study and a presentation at next year's conference.
- There was one church plant that graduated and became a particular church (Freedom BFC of Dauphin, PA)
- 11 men were ordained or recognized for a previous ordination, including Pastor Tim Gibson
- 5) **G.R.O.W.** Preparation continues to be made to put this program into place that will follow-up with visitors and shut-ins. People will be trained so that they can minister effectively. Kinship groups will be used as a catalyst in this endeavor. The training is this coming Saturday, May 17th. Lord-willing this will become a larger church-wide endeavor. We want to become even friendlier and follow up better with visitors.
- 6) **Personnel Manual** Byron Roth explained that work continues on the personnel manual.
- 7) **Shepherd's List** Pastor Tim encouraged us to continue to follow up with our shepherd's lists and minister to church families.
- 8) **Membership and Discipline** The elders discussed a few individuals who are being discipled and one that is in need of follow-up and discipline.

- Expenses for April were 98% of the budgeted forecast while the YTD expenses were 95% of the budgeted forecast. We should remain vigilant over the next few months in spending.



### Pastor Tim's Ministry Report May 12, 2014

**Studying & Preaching:** We have plummeted the depths of Christ's superior and supreme ministry through the book of Hebrews. We have now finished the doctrinal section of the book ending in 10:18 and now are moving forward to the practical living section of the book. It has been a rich study and I hope and pray that the body of Christ at Ebenezer has been strengthened and has understood the exclusive ministry of Jesus to the Saints. I look forward to preaching through the end of chapter 10 this month, which specifically deals with our immediate response to the things we have heard about who Jesus is. This chapter is very pointed and deals with difficult subject matter. Studying & preparation takes up most of my time during the week.

**LEAD Men's Leadership Training**: I have one class left, which will meet in a couple of weeks. Once this class is complete I will continue to pray that the Holy Spirit would lead us to new leaders, both Elders and Deacons. The nominating committee as well as Elders will interview candidates, and hopefully as the Lord leads we may have new leaders by the Fall of 2014.

### **Worship Ministries: (From Jennie Flicker)**

It was so nice to have extra musicians join us for Easter Sunday worship. Things went smoothly. We had a nice turnout for the Sunrise Service. The potluck breakfast was not as well attended as other years. The choir is finished singing until we begin again in September. A few of our college students are back to join the worship team this summer. We always lose a few folks because of their summer commitments, too. Pat DiStefano joined me to do the music for the Fellowship Community service this past month. The Simulcast Service group that Wayne Batten organized has decided that this ministry will now fall under Worship Ministries for future vision, budgeting, and implementation. We will make final decisions regarding the committee members at our next meeting TBD. Jason Lee and Kevin Gascho are doing much of the legwork for this project. Things may potentially be ready by late September / early October. Details are being worked out.

<u>Counseling</u>: I am about to finish up 2 separate pre-marital counseling sessions. They have gone extremely well. I am currently mentoring a new attendee once a week. I continue to have several counseling sessions each week.

New Member Class: Pastor Dick & I have begun teaching the new member class. Dick teaches the first 2 sessions which cover purpose & structure while I teach the last 2 sessions on doctrine. Currently we have almost 20 people attending the class. We are also videoing the sessions so that we can put them online. We are hoping that these online videos can be used in 2 ways: 1) To provide people another means to go through the class, especially those who have a difficult time attending the class, and 2) to provide a way for class members to watch sessions that they missed. Providing online classes with interactive test questions to ensure that the students have actually watched the sessions will provide our people with "at-home" access to our teaching. While we will never do away with "live" classes, having these videos online will hopefully provide more tools for our people and lessen our load.

**Reading:** Over the last month I have committed to more reading. I read John MacArthur's book "Strange Fire." This book provided a biblical basis for the cessation of the sign gifts. MacArthur (& others) analyze the foundational flaws of the charismatic movement. I have also read half of the preaching book "The Heart is the Target" by Murray Capill. The goal of this book is to improve the application portion of preaching from every text. It is proving to be very helpful. I am hoping to improve in the area of application. I have also read a book entitled "Is God anti-gay" by Sam Allberry. Books for future reading include: "The (Unadjusted) Gospel" by Dever, Duncan, Mohler & Mahaney, "The Greatest Fight in the World" by Spurgeon, "The Life of Martyn Lloyd Jones" by Iain Murray, & "Stepping Out in Faith" by Mark Gilbert.

Christian Beliefs Class: It is time again to teach theology at Ebenezer. I taught the class last May with almost 100 in attendance. I am now opening it back up and we have about 25 people signed up to cover 20 basic theological issues every Christian should know. The book being used is by Wayne Grudem. I am looking forward to teaching this class on Wednesday night in May – July. It is a great introduction to theology and a necessary foundational class for our people. I truly believe if we give our people a steady diet of good theology, it will not only unify us, but equip the Saints for the work of the ministry and simply for holy living.

**<u>Kinship Group:</u>** We are about to end our Kinship Group until the Fall. We will have one more time together and a couple over the summer. It has been a great time together.

**Wednesday Night Bible Study/Prayer Meeting**: I continue to lead a bible study through the book of Matthew on Wednesday night. Attendance is somewhat small, but we have a rich time together studying and praying. Pastor Dick is going to teach the class during the summer while I teach the Christian Beliefs Class.

**BFC Conference:** The conference turned out to be a real encouragement. The theme was multi-cultural/ethnic diversity. While it was well received, I felt like it was a topic that had been previously addressed and not as pressing as other issues. Two new revisions of our articles of faith were approved: Kingdom of God & The Lord's Day.

It continues to be a joy to serve the Lord here at Ebenezer Bible Fellowship Church. I am thankful for the unity among our staff and in our congregation. I continue to pray that the Word of God would equip the Saints and that Ebenezer would be a beacon in the Lehigh Valley, which focuses on biblical preaching, and reaching the lost. We are definitely seeing the Lord work as new people are coming to our Church on a regular basis.

### POD (Pastor of Discipleship) Report –Apr/May 2014

I am currently reading through the five books of Moses and one theme seems to be significant above all others in reference to God and his chosen people...

"For I am the Lord who brought you up out of the land of Egypt to be your God. You shall therefore be **holy**, for I am **holy**."" (Leviticus 11:45, ESV)

This is not just an isolated passage, in fact, just in the Pentateuch alone, Moses uses the word "holy" 197 times in 171 verses. Therefore, holiness, which means to set apart, consecrate, having the characteristics of moral or ritual purity, is not some by-the-way word, it is central to all the commands that God gives his people. God commanded his people not just to be different from everyone else, but to be like he is. When we realize the standard, we understand it's impossibility in our depraved humanness. Only through the blood of Jesus Christ and the imputation of his righteousness to us, can we truly be holy as God is holy.

Now our responsibility and passion is to live out that holiness in the present evil age. "Oh, Lord, may your holiness be seen in me as I walk and talk amidst the darkness of this world, Amen."

With that in mind, here is a guick summary of some of the ministry opportunities from April/May 2014:

### **Kids Crossing**

### Discipleship Support
