Part I: Joint Elder & Deacon Meeting

Roll Call:

Praver:

Pastor Jason Hoy opened the meeting in prayer.

Discussion:

- Pastor Jason Hoy led a discussion on the current state of Ebenezer based on the four pillars of the church which have been introduced during the current sermon series. Prayer, Praise, Proclamation, People (inside and outside) of the Church.
- The discussion focused on both strengths and weaknesses as the men had a candid conversation about striving towards leading the Church to be the beautiful bride of Christ.

Parish Nursing Ministry Proposal:

- In April Carol Warner, member of EBFC, proposed a Parish Nursing Program be adopted at EBFC with her serving as the ministry point of contact. (see April 9th Board of Elders Meeting minutes)
- The elders discussed it further with the Deacons who were generally agreeable to the concept.
- There were a few questions and concerns that will be shared with Carol Warner before proceeding. Mike agreed to contact Carol for the follow-up.

Transportation Discussion:

- Reading, PA Bible Fellowship Church is in need of a van for their ministry and outreach purposes.
- EBFC Deacons have been preparing to trade-in the current van and purchase a slightly used van in the coming 6-12 months, pending the transportation fund and budget allows for this.
- In light of Reading BFC's need, we will review the potential of donating the current van to them
 and purchasing our vehicle more quickly than originally planned so that we can support them in
 the Kingdom-building work.
- In general the Elders and Deacons were agreeable with this approach and Treasurer, Andy Brimer, asked Deacon, Mark Hardy to follow up with specifics and to speak with Reading, PA. Mark will specifically ask them to ensure that the current van would meet their needs and discern that it will be safe for those usages.

Ushering:

There was a brief discussion about the proper way to handle families with small children that may be disruptive in the worship service. First and foremost, we want to be loving towards all parties and come alongside parents, especially who are alone with the children, to make them more comfortable in a private room like the Parlor if appropriate. At the same time, we should also ensure that congregants who protest about a situation, family or child that they do so graciously and in Christian love.

Security:

- The security team expressed their concern about the situation that occurred on Easter Sunday
 where an unknown male was found to be roaming the church at early hours. They reinforced
 the importance of having more than one person in the church at any given time and that we
 should remain diligent in our awareness of strangers roaming the church.
- Action: Rob Lofthouse, Deacon and Security lead, will be asked to write a short memo to be shared with all ministry volunteers who come to the church during off hours. This document will reinforce our security standards and encourage congregants and staff to be more proactive.
- Action: Mark Culton will speak with Jennie Flicker and Worship Team members to enlist their support and renewed caution particularly for Sunday mornings.

Flowers For Freedom:

The men discussed the recent communications surrounding the Flowers For Freedom program held in April. There were no issues, only that the men wanted to clarify that events such as these truly are the responsibility of the Deacons and the elders do not want to circumvent their authority or get involved when we do not need to do so.

Adjournment:

Chairman of the Board of Deacons, Bruce Eckel closed this portion of the meeting in prayer.

Part II: Board of Elders Meeting

Approval of Minutes:

Motion was made to approve the minutes from the Board of Elders meeting on April 9th along with edit, seconded and passed.

Financial Report:

- Treasurer, Andy Brimer reviewed the May report. (Attachment #1)
- Andy praised God for His faithfulness in April and all year as giving is above budget.
- Motion was made to approve the report, seconded and passed.
- Andy shared an updated proposal from the Deacons to cover the cost of the HVAC unit in one of the classrooms that needs to be replaced after breaking down.
- Maintenance on the organ was not budgeted for 2012. This was an oversight, but the cost can be absorbed within the current expenses which are below budget year-to-date.
- We are currently experiencing some performance problems with the piano. The repair man has come out repeatedly to repair it many times without charge to us; yet, the problems have continued. The piano is still under warranty so we are pursuing our options for replacement. Resolution to this matter is being pursued by the Worship Committee. No actions are required at this time.

Preparation for Senior Pastor Candidate Visit:

- The men reviewed the schedule of events to take place June 2-3.
- Mike Capaldi, SP Committee Chair provided the men with a communication that would be sent to the congregation by Wednesday's e-Newsletter and Sunday's bulletin insert. The elders approved its content.
- Pastor Mark Culton was kind enough to open his home up to the Gibson family on Sunday
 afternoon and invite some of the kids and staff from the Youth program so that the Gibson's
 children would feel welcomed.

Bridge Ministry Update:

- This has been a topic of the past two elders meetings and was briefly discussed with the Deacons earlier in the Joint Deacon & Elder meeting.
- Some of the elders still are trying to visit the ministry on Wednesday night and in lieu of Elder Wayne Batten's absence we decided to table the conversation until next time. This also allows those who haven't attended yet the opportunity to do so.

Annual Conference Discussion:

- The elders discussed further some of the outcomes from the Bible Fellowship Church Denomination's Annual Conference held on April 24-26th at Pinebrook.
- A two-page summary of the conference was shared with the congregation through the email newsletter and hard copies in the foyer beginning May 2nd. (Attachment #2)
- We will give a verbal report at the mid-year Congregational Meeting.

Discussion Items:

- People Matter: The men discussed a people matter recently dealt with in keeping with Matt. 18.
- Roof Repairs & Ushering: Deacon Liaison, Shawn Sommons updated the elders on the roof repairs and that the Deacons continue to discuss the importance of Ushering in light of some recent incidents.
- Forks Church Planting: Tim Zuck, Pastor at Saucon BFC and Church Planter recently conducted field work in Forks Township in Easton. He shared his findings with a group representing several BFC churches in the area and is excited to begin meeting with residents in Forks Township to begin the long planning process for planting a church in Forks. The elders welcome these continued discussions with Tim and agree that he should contact Ebenezer members in the Forks area to gauge their interest in this effort.



REPORT OF THE 129TH BIBLE FELLOWSHIP CHURCH CONFERENCE April 23 – 25, 2012

Beginning with a prayer thanking the Lord for His sovereignty and asking that His Spirit guide the proceedings, Moderator Randall A. Grossman called the 129th BFC Conference to order at 1:00 P.M., Monday, April 23, 2012.

The theme of BFC Conference was Discipleship. Pastor James Arcieri, Red Hill, PA, led in worship through songs which focused on the kingship of Christ. Conference was challenged in a message by Moderator Grossman from Joshua 1 to be strong and courageous.

The first session consisted of essential business including appointing Conference Committees, introducing new members, receiving reports from various boards and committees, and elections. Mark A. Bickel, Colby Weinhofer, and R. Scott Wright were approved for ordination.

During the Report of the Conference Pastor, Ronald C. Mahurin, Pastors Marcos Ramirez, Iglesia Biblica La Roca de Mérida, Mérida, Yucatá, Mexico; Timothy M. Zuck, Hellertown, PA; Joshua Allen, Las Cruces, NM; and Daniel L. Williams, Woodbury Heights, NJ were asked to share the joys and prayer concerns from their respective churches. Praise was given to the Lord that all four younger churches reported substantial numerical and spiritual growth and asked only that Conference pray for the physical resources to continue growing.

During the Monday evening session, Dana E. Weller, Director of the Board of Missions, and David E. Gundrum, Director of Church Extension Ministries, presented their reports. Pastor Weller encouraged everyone to continue to be faithful to missions and to take advantage of Board of Missions resources. All missionaries present were asked to introduce themselves.

Pastor Gundrum spoke briefly highlighting the importance of daughter churches ("churches planting churches"). Four church planters (Ronald B. Smith, Townsend, DE; R. Scott Wright, Lower Providence Township, PA; Keith Strunk, Cape Community Church, Cape May Court House, NJ; and Miguel Gonzalez, Assistant Church Planter under the B.O.M.) presented their works, and a report was read by Pastor Ramirez introducing church planter Freddy Chi, Villa Magna, Yucatá, Mexico. Notably, the works in Townsend, Lower Providence, and Villa Magna are daughter churches.

The evening session was adjourned for a time of worship. Pastor Carlos G. Rodriguez and others from La Roca de Reading, Reading, PA led in worship. Praise was offered joyfully in both English and Spanish. Guest speaker, Dr. Gene A. Getz preached a message entitled, "The Measure of a Healthy Church". Through an examination of the epistles, he concluded that a church ought to be measured by its work of faith, endurance of hope, and labor of love.

The third session began on Tuesday morning with devotional thoughts and songs led by Pastor Arcieri about the name of the Lord. Reports were presented by Executive Director David T. Allen, the BFC Executive Board, Pinebrook Bible Conference, and Victory Valley Camp.

Conference received the two reports (majority and minority) from the Study Committee on Sabbath and heard explanations of both positions. After extensive debate, which spanned the morning and afternoon sessions, Conference voted on the majority resolution which removes the idea of Sabbath from Article 21: "The Lord's Day" of the Articles of Faith. The resolution passed at first reading, receiving the necessary two-thirds majority by only one vote.

Also during the Tuesday afternoon session, Conference accepted the report of the Study Committee on the Kingdom. After a few minor corrections, a resolution to replace the current Article 27: "The Millennium" with a new article entitled "The Kingdom of God" was passed at first reading. Both articles, according to our rules for changes in the Articles of Faith, will now be presented to the churches who will have until the 131st BFC Conference (24 months) to approve or disapprove.

No business was conducted during the Tuesday evening session. Pastor Arcieri led in worship once again, this time on the theme of Christ the Foundation. Dr. Getz preached a message entitled, "Producing a Healthy Church." He encouraged everyone to focus on three experiences which produce a healthy church: a vital learning experience with the Word of God, a vital relational experience with one another and with God, and a vital corporate and personal witness experience.

After a short break, a service of ordination was held for three men approved for ordination during the Monday afternoon session. Each man gave his testimony, and then a charge was given to them by Pastor Carl J. Fischer, Jr. reminding them of the seriousness of their calling. A transcript of each testimony will be printed in a future edition of BFC OneVoice.

On Wednesday, Pastor Arcieri led in a final time of worship. Dr. Getz preached on the topic of "Building Up One Another"

After a brief break, Conference considered a disagreement between the Ministerial Credentials Committee and one of our churches. Discussion continued until after lunch. Because of the sensitive nature of the issue, Moderator Grossman called on Pastor William G. Schlonecker to lead Conference in prayer for the Lord's guidance. The Conference finally referred the disagreement to the Conference Judicatory for review and, hopefully, resolution. This will be the first time the Conference Judicatory has been called into service during its twenty-seven year existence and not really for its intended purpose. Another prayer was offered for continued wisdom and guidance.

Next, the Report of the Study Committee on the Biblical Principles for Living was received. The committee requested a straw poll to determine which of the ten issues they presented Conference was most interested in examining. The committee was reappointed to continue their work. This was the first report by this committee which was set up to suggest changes and updates to the Biblical Principles for Living every seven years.

The day was concluded by considering unfinished business and appointing men to various committees and positions, and a closing prayer was offered.

The 129th BFC Conference thanks Pinebrook Bible Conference for its hospitality, the men who served in various capacities for their faithfulness, and, most importantly, the Lord for his guidance during every session. By God's grace, may we return next year having made progress in making disciples of the Lord Jesus Christ to His honor and glory.

POD (Pastor of Discipleship) Cast – Apr/May 2012

Praise the Lord for His presence as I've been personally studying the book of Isaiah. Realizing that the prophet is forth telling the judgment of God upon Israel's consistently sinful condition, it would leave one to believe that the situation is hopeless. Yet in the midst of Isaiah prophecy of punishment, we read these amazing words:

"I But now thus says the LORD, he who created you, O Jacob, he who formed you, O Israel: "Fear not, for I have redeemed you; I have called you by name, you are mine. When you pass through the waters, I will be with you; and through the rivers, they shall not overwhelm you; when you walk through fire you shall not be burned, and the flame shall not consume you. For I am the LORD your God, the Holy One of Israel, your Savior." (Is 43: I-3 ESV)

How amazing is our God! Whether we are being tried for growth or disciplined for sin through deep waters or flame, God has chosen to go through it with us...why? Because, He says, "I have called you by name, you are mine." He never loses sight of those who are His, nor does He ever forget the plan He has for them...so take courage, for He has promised, "I will never leave you nor forsake you." (Heb 13:5 ESV)

With that in mind, here is a quick summary of some of the ministry opportunities from April/May:

Student Ministries Report - April 2012

1 John 1:1-4

That which was from the beginning, which we have heard, which we have seen with our eyes, which we looked upon and have touched with our hands, concerning the word of life—the life was made manifest, and we have seen it, and testify to it and proclaim to you the eternal life, which was with the Father and was made manifest to us—that which we have seen and heard we proclaim also to you, so that you too may have fellowship with us; and indeed our fellowship is with the Father and with his Son Jesus Christ. And we are writing these things so that our joy may be complete.

I recently read an article about one of the factors that is contributing to the "slow fade" of twenty-somethings. - a lack of relationship.

Do our students understand that we can have a vibrant relationship with the Almighty God of the universe? Despite our monumental sin, this holy God has made a way through His only Son - and we can actually walk and talk with God.

It is one thing to go to church and become well versed in Biblical doctrine (and I think doctrine is very important!). It is another thing to **experience** what it means to know God. Could it be true that many of our young people who walk away from the faith do so because it was never real for them; because they don't know God intimately? I think so.

1 John starts off with the apostle sharing his experience of knowing Jesus Christ intimately - and then the purpose for his letter - that the readers (including us), might have fellowship with God and other believers. It's all about relationship.

And so one of the things we hope to do in student ministry is give teens the opportunity to experience Christ. We also believe it is important to give students the opportunity to share about their relationship with God - with hopes that this will help our students understand what it means to have fellowship with God.

While the solution to the problem of the "slow fade" is not a simple one, one thing is for sure - we must show students what it means to walk and talk with Jesus. It doesn't get much simpler or more important than that.
