

Board of Elders Meeting June 10, 2013

Opening & Roll:

• Elders present: Gibson, Hoy, Bickings, Culton, Batten, Sommons, Brimer

• Excused Absent: Capaldi, Holwick

Devotion & Prayer:

- The elders continued their review of the Articles of Faith by reviewing Article 27, *The Millennium*.
- There was a time of prayer focused on praying for the needs of our church body.

Approval of the Minutes:

 Motion was made to approve the minutes from the May 13, 2013 Board of Elders Meeting, seconded and approved.

Financial Report:

- Treasurer, Andy Brimer reviewed the May Financial Report. (Attachment 1) Motion was made to approve the report, seconded and passed.
- Giving is a bit down, and yet spending is in-check so far.
- The Finance Committee will be meeting with pastoral staff to discuss finances so far for the year and what remains. This is an attempt to be proactive and prepare before the end of the year when budgets are put together.
- Andy is doing some research with different banks to make sure we are being good stewards and getting the best deal. He believes it would be good to be diversified.
- <u>Bible Bee Finances</u> Andy proposed the following:

A non-expense account be set-up under Discipleship Ministries for the purpose of receiving monies that have been donated to the Shelby Kennedy Foundation in support of the local contest of the National Bible Bee for 2013. The funds will be distributed to Peggy Brimer, and someone other than Andrew Brimer will approve the disbursement of funds on a regular basis such that the account will not have any remaining funds past December 31, 2013. **Motion** was made, seconded and passed with Andy Brimer abstaining.

Discussion Items:

- 1) <u>Facilities Agreement between Ebenezer BFC and BCS</u>: Byron Roth was asked by the deacons to do some number crunching and evaluation of the existing agreement. The deacons then met with Byron and feel very comfortable with Byron's findings and the agreement. His evaluation is that the agreement is fair and makes sense. There was some discussion by the elders about the shared space between EBFC and BCS with regards to rooms 4 and 5. The elders will revisit this agreement at the July 8th meeting.
- 2) <u>College Ministry</u>: The elders discussed potential ministry with college students. This is multipronged as we want to reach current Ebenezer college students as well as unchurched college students. The elders were in agreement that we should proceed with plans to provide transportation, fellowship and hospitality to college students. Pastor Mark is meeting with individuals now to develop plans for this fall.
- 3) Getty Concert: Pastor Jason brought a possible joint venture between BFC churches to host a Getty concert. This concert costs \$18,000, and the idea is that each of the 4 BFC churches who are involved will pay a \$1,000 deposit. Motion was made to support this endeavor and pay up to

- \$1,000 from Ebenezer with the expectation that this would be reimbursed with ticket sales. **Motion** was seconded and passed with 6 yes and 1 no.
- 4) <u>Core Values</u>: The elders discussed at length what our core values currently are and what they should be. This was an edifying discussion that will continue.
- 5) New Members: **Motion** was made to approve the membership applications for Candace Mason and Robyn Paul. The **Motion** was seconded and passed unanimously.

In reviewing the financial statements I would like to make the following comments:

- Income for May was 83% of the budgeted forecast while the YTD income was at 95% of the annual forecast.
- Expenses for May were 95% of the budgeted forecast while the YTD expenses were at 98% of the annual forecast.
- Including this year, May has been consistently a low giving month for three of the last four years without any clear indication for the pattern.
- Ministry leaders are doing a very good job of spending according to budget.
- The Finance Committee met May 21, 2013 and highlights of the discussion were:
 - o addressing 2012 Audit findings
 - o meet with ministry leaders to discuss spending during June/July
 - o banking options and mechanisms for online donations

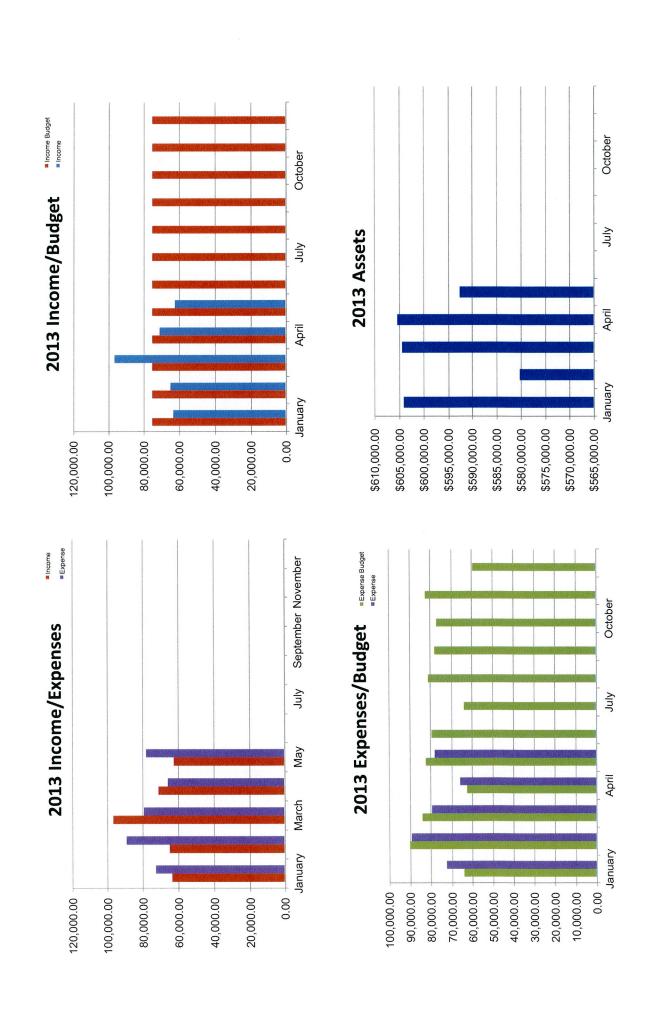

Preaching: The study of Philippians has come to a close and I feel like the Lord really used it in the lives of the saints at Ebenezer. I had thought about doing a series on deadly sins, but have chosen not to go that route, due to a few comments that I have heard in the Christian Beliefs class. I feel a study about true regeneration is needed. Therefore, I have begun a study I've entitled "Blessed Assurance." This 6 part series will look at the true religious affections that inevitably accompany the new birth. We began in John 3 last week looking at the necessity of the new birth. The following sermons will cover the tests that John's epistle give to true believers granting them assurance that they have truly been born again. I believe this series is going to be beneficial for our people, as many have not understood Lordship salvation. Being born again does not mean that someone has prayed a prayer. But rather with regeneration comes clear submission to the Lordship of Christ, which is what John teaches in his epistles. My prayer is that this study will strengthen us.

<u>Christian Beliefs Class</u>: I have two more lectures to complete the 14 week theological study of the basics. I have been extremely encouraged by the response to the class. Many have told me how they have benefited from the class. I hope to continue to use this material to teach this class at least once a year at Ebenezer.

Worship Ministries: (From Jennie)

The Adult Choir is currently on break for the Summer. Our member total stayed around the same as when we started in the Fall. This has been the pattern for this ministry the past few years. Sound Room Ministry held an interest session where folks could come and find out about the ministry. Seven people attended. We will be training four new people. We have discussed the possibility of streaming our services online so that congregation members who cannot attend Sunday morning worship (shut-ins, family obligations, and work situations, among others) can still participate. Worship Team Ministry is going very well. We just added a musician who plays bass and guitar. It is a blessing to work with all of these musicians. It is rare to have a ministry like this with such camaraderie. I believe the piano tuning issues (which were a manufacturer defect) are finally being resolved. We did not renew the Allen Organ service contract this year. As worship coordinator, my priority right now (besides my regular duties) is to seek out new music for worship and special music that is solid lyrically and accessible musically. Also, I'm eager to get more of our children and youth involved. Most specifically, I'm targeting those who play instruments.

<u>Staff</u>: Overall, the staff is working hard and in good spirits. I am praying about what book to take the staff through in the Fall.

Internship: Preston Young has shown an interest in ministry, and possible feels like the Lord may be calling him into full time ministry. We are going to provide him with a 10 week internship at EBFC. The goal of this internship will mainly be to pour our lives and teaching into this young man. We are asking him to read several books that will help him grow in theology, ministry philosophy, hermeneutics, etc. I will be spending at least 2 hours each week with him one-on-one discussing theology over the summer. Pastor Mark and Dick will also be participating in the internship.

Leadership: I am gearing up for the fall. Initially I had thought that I might begin our leadership training in the summer, but the Lord has led me to begin in the fall. I will be promoting the leadership classes (LEAD, as presented in last month's notes) as well as hand picking several men to participate in hopes that the Lord will raise up teachers, deacons and elders to serve at EBFC.

<u>Counseling/Mentoring</u>: I continue to meet with one man each week. I also counsel as needed. In the last month I have had many opportunities. I am also doing pre-marital counseling each week for 10 weeks with Pastor Mark.

It has been a great Winter and Spring. I am looking forward to the Summer and the Fall. My family continues to transition. The Lord is so good to us. We are thankful for our Ebenezer family. We love being here serving our Lord together with such a wonderful staff.

POD (Pastor of Discipleship) Report – May/Jun 2013

In my current personal study of the book of Acts, I recently came upon this passage...

"And the hand of the Lord was with them, and a great number who believed turned to the Lord." (Acts 11:21, ESV)

We call the book of Acts, the "Acts of the Apostles", when in reality, we should call it, "The Acts of God though His Apostles". For in the book of Acts, we see the effort of God's people obeying God's word, doing God's work, and the hand of God bringing about the results. Oh may we never lose that perspective in ministry...our efforts will be fruitless unless the hand of the Lord is with us.

"Oh Lord, may I look at each day from this perspective...it's not my ministry or my gifts or my skills that brings about ministry success, but it's your hand upon me that does so, Amen."

With that in mind, here is a quick summary of some of the ministry opportunities from May/June 2013:

Kids Crossing

- Cross Time Sunday School:
 - Praise the Lord; Doris and Don Lynch will be taking over in the Ist & 2nd-grade class for the odd months, beginning in July, and Jesus and Sherri Rodriguez will be doing the Ist & 2nd-grade even months, beginning in October.
 - Curriculum change: The Simulcast, scheduled for May 17-18, was canceled by LifeWay at the last minute due to some confusion regarding its purpose. We will be hosting our own training for this new curriculum on July 22 with our LifeWay representative, Gary Jennings, here at the church.
- Early Childhood (2&3 year-olds): No change.
- Children's Church: The Gospel Project curriculum has a worship component that should work well for Children's Church. Also, please pray for our teams, which have been stable for a long time but will probably be losing one team soon. More about this later.
- Wednesday Evening Programs: Dave Lissy and his team continue to put the finishing touches on the new Awana program set to begin in September 2013. Since our Awana promotion Sunday on June 2, we have around 25 volunteers who have signed up. There will be a volunteer open house/training event scheduled for June 18, from 5-9 PM. Please continue to pray that the Lord brings in the necessary volunteers for this very important children's ministry.
- **VBS 2013 (June 24-28):** Carol Burress and her team are diligently putting the final touches on VBS, with this years theme, "Athens: Paul's Dangerous Journey". Currently, there are 74 children registered, and 62 adult/teen volunteers.

- Women's Ministry: Here is an update from Laura...

"Women's ministry seems to going full steam ahead for summer. I am so excited that we have about 40 women signed up to be a part of the summer study. Last week was our first meeting, and we didn't have all there that were signed up, but that is to be expected for the summer. I am happy to have Robin Laudenslager, Melissa Griffin, and Vicki Cowley has my discussion group leaders.

MOPS has ended for the summer as well. We do have a new team member; Abby Yorgey will be taking over creative activities. We are very excited to have her. WE do have a big need as far as a MOPPETS team leader. This person is in charge of all childcare workers. Please pray that this position would be filled soon. We do have meetings planned throughout the summer and are well on our way for planning for the fall. Alyssa Nye is doing a great job as the leader of MOPS.

Amy Hardy has stepped off the WM team for a while to have her baby and we hope to have her back in the winter.

Doris Lynch and myself finally have the web page organized and updated through the end of the year. Most of that is complete, just need to finalize some dates for that. So anyone can go to the web page and see what is coming for the rest of the summer and fall, and winter.

Beth Moore will be coming to Philadelphia in May of 2014 and Jessie Seneca has asked me to help her organize busses and details for that event.

I am very much promoting the SHE LEADS conference. This will be an excellent conference for the women of our church, especially our pastor wives. For every 3 people that come to this, one pastor wife may go for free...more info to come on that.

Met with Pat Destefano and had a great visit to see how we can incorporate the prime timers into WM. That I hope will happen. I am hoping to meet with some more women that I don't know too well yet.

Future: Looking into retreat settings for the women. This will be a big deal, and cost some money, so I don't know how well of a response I will have for something like this. But, as I said, just beginning stages of it."
