The elders set December 7th as the Congregational Budget Meeting. The meeting will be at 6pm.

Bible Bee

Andy gave an update about the Bible Bee Closing Ceremony. Families have testified that it really benefited them. We had 14 local contestants that qualified for Nationals.

Griefshare

Shawn shared how he is preparing for Griefshare and Divorcecare. This is a ministry that has really ministered to individuals in the past and has brought people into the church.



Pastor Tim's Ministry Report August, 2014

Studying & Preaching: Studying the application of Hebrews 12 & 13 has been a joy as we discover how to "Finish the Race." I am beginning to pray about the direction for the future. I am possibly thinking about preaching from the Old Testament in order to keep a balance.

Worship Ministries/Vison: I am helping provide leadership in how EBFC should proceed since the resignation of Jennie Flicker as our Worship Coordinator. With the input of the other pastors, I was able to construct a vision for the future worship ministry at Ebenezer to present to the Elders. This included a vision for the type of person we intend to hire in place of the worship coordinator (Jennie Flicker). It also included a vision for the style of worship as well as a detailed job description.

Pre-marital Counseling/Weddings: I performed the ceremony for one couple on August 30-31. I finished up premarital counseling for a couple in our church, who I married on September 6.

Funerals: I was able to minister to the Ray Moretz family by performing the funeral for Bro. Ray on Sept 6. I also was able to perform a graveside service for Fay Lintner, the mother of Jody Bonner (grandmother of Tori Bonner).

Membership Interviews: I was able to interview Rick Smith, Judy Smale, Nancy Boring.

Fellowship/Mentoring: This month was heavy with meetings with all sorts of church members for encouragement/accountability. I was able to have breakfast/lunch 8 different times. I also meet with one man every other Wednesday for mentoring/teaching/accountability.

Shepherding/Counseling: Counseling has also gotten heavier this month. I met with several (5) people for one time counseling sessions. I have also begun counseling a couple on a regular basis concerning their marriage. We meet every other week.

Potential Elder Interviews: I was able to meet with 5 men and discuss the potentiality of them coming on as Elders and going through the nominating process.

Christian Beliefs Class: I finished up the doctrinal class on August 20. It was a great success and those who attended told me how much they benefited from the class. I believe that class is crucial for our people and will continue to teach it on a yearly basis.

This month was filled with many meetings, weddings, funerals, & administration. I feel like the "honeymoon" is over and I have truly stepped into the role of a pastor here at Ebenezer. It is with joy that I serve our Lord. While there seems to be so much happening, I find my greatest joy in teaching the Word, theology and meeting and loving people! I'm honored to be here at Ebenezer!

POD (Pastor of Discipleship) Report –Aug/Sep 2014

I am currently in the book of Joshua where I read these timeless words at the end of in chapter 21...

"Thus the Lord gave to Israel all the land that he swore to give to their fathers. And they took possession of it, and they settled there. And the Lord gave them rest on every side just as he had sworn to their fathers. Not one of all their enemies had withstood them, for the Lord had given all their enemies into their hands. Not one word of all the good promises that the Lord had made to the house of Israel had failed; all came to pass." (Joshua 21:43-45, ESV)

What struck me about this passage is how God promises stood, regardless of time, people, enemies, natural disasters, etc. Though almost five hundred years had past since God promised Abraham a seed, and a land, nothing thwarted that plan. In the same way, God has given us the promise of his presence, his love, his indwelling Spirit, etc., and nothing will thwart his plan in our lives personally, or in the life of his true church!

Kids Crossing
