

# **Board of Elders Meeting September 14, 2015**

# **Roll Call & Prayer**

# **Devotional & Prayer**

Pastor Tim shared a devotional with the elders about integrity and sexual purity from Proverbs 5.

# **Financial Report**

Andy reviewed the financial report (*Attachment 1*). Giving and spending were both higher than projected. We should keep an eye on spending throughout the rest of the year. A **motion** was made to approve the financial report. This was **seconded** and **passed** unanimously. Andy reported the following:

- The fraudulent donation Ebenezer received last month is almost resolved.
- Paypal is now in effect for events like Awana and Run for the Children.
- The finance team has met and discussed a projected budget for next year. They are recommending a 3% decrease in the budget from this year's budget.

# **Approval of Minutes**

**Motion** was made to approve the minutes from the August 10, 2015 Elders meeting, **seconded** and **passed**.

# **Discussion Items**

- 1) <u>Prayer Week</u> The elders discussed the idea of scheduling a week to focus on prayer and rest. A motion was made to have a week of focused prayer in the Spring which will be spearheaded by the elders. This motion was **seconded** and unanimously **approved**.
- 2) <u>Outdoor Service</u> Jeremy reported that there have been hurdles to jump with the township and the permits required, but we are taking them one by one. Things are coming together and plans have been made for setting up on Friday and Saturday.
- 3) <u>Foyer Renovations</u> Wayne shared with the board a list of objectives for the foyer renovation and how these objectives will be accomplished (*attachment 2*).
- 4) <u>EBFC and BCS Facilities Agreement</u> The elders discussed and made a **motion** to accept the 2015-2016 facilities agreement. This was **seconded** and **passed**.
- 5) <u>Awana Teaching</u> The elders will now be teaching Sparks in addition to the rest of the Awana children.
- 6) Newcomer Dessert Kevin and Amy Hardy will host a dessert on Saturday, October 10. The idea of having various elders host was discussed.
- 7) <u>Ministry Assimilation</u> Though Kevin Hardy could not make the meeting, he included the following update via email:
  - Worked with Rich Mastronardo and Andy Brimer to set up the Networking class during Sunday School hour beginning 9/13. 7-8 sessions will include Networking/Discipleship material followed by 4-5 weeks on our Biblical Principles for Living - great instruction for our lives as we are actively serving in ministry.
  - Pulled new member list from the past two years and sent an email to the group encouraging them to consider how they are gifted to serve at Ebenezer, if they're not actively serving already, and to consider attending Networking this fall.
- 8) Evangelism Pat reported on their first evangelism training which was successful.
  17 attended. They have another scheduled for November 7. Pat drew our attention to the prayer cards which are available for people to take home and pray for the salvation of those they know.
- 9) <u>Ministry Focus</u> Andy challenged us to become even more focused as we go into 2016 with our ministries. What are the things that we really feel God is leading us to do?
- 10) <u>Kinship Groups</u> There was discussion on the idea of connecting kinship groups so that they can join efforts to serve at the Bridge Ministry. This will be pursued. The elders also discussed kinship groups adopting missionaries and shut-ins.

Financial Report for September 2015

The September 2015 Financial Report has the following attachments:

- August Financial Statement
- YTD Financial Statement
- Graphical representation of Income and Expenses vs Budget, Income vs Expense trends, and Asset trends

In reviewing the financial statements I would like to make the following comments:

- Total income for August was 97% of the budgeted forecast while the YTD income was 95% of the budgeted forecast.
- Expenses for August were 107% of the budgeted forecast while the YTD expenses were 97% of the annual forecast. *Note:* The expenses appear high by \$3000 because the resolution of the fraudulent donation matter remains open.
- Giving continues to lag a bit, but our spending for the past three months has been greater than the budgeted and giving amounts.

### Other:

- The fraudulent donation matter is almost closed. No report was made to the Bethlehem Township Police.
- PayPal is being used for online registrations and payments for AWANA, The Bethel Bible Series, and Run for the Children.
- The Finance Committee is meeting September 15, 2016; one item for discussion will be the 2016 budgeting process.

In our combined deacon/elders meeting I indicated that the property committee would provide a list of objectives for the project as well as a description of how we plan on reaching those objectives. I think our explanations should be relatively brief. Since I was the one who indicated we would do this I thought I would put on paper what I understand as a beginning point. When could we discuss this so it could be forwarded to the deacons and elders. I don't think we should do much until we have their approval on the basic project as we see it now even if its a little different than shown below. Let me know if you think things should be added or deleted.

# **PROJECT OBJECTIVES**

- 1 Update finishes for a clean, fresh appearance.
- 2 Provide new lighting for an updated appearance and more efficient fixtures.
- 3 Reinforce the entry path to the main sanctuary entrance.
- 4 Provide a new welcome center.
- 5 Enlargr the area by removing the walls enclosing classroom two.
- 6 Provide new foyer furnishings for display, ministry functions, waiting and conversation carefully placed to complement the path of sanctuary access.

# METHODOLOGY TO REACH OBJECTIVES

- 1 Updating of finishes
  - a New wall finishes-primarily paint
  - b New ceiling finishes having approximately the same acoustical properties as the existing materials.
  - c New flooring- Use multiple materials, patterns or colors to help define the path of travel from the building entry to the main sanctuary entry.
- 2 Provide new lighting for an updated appearance. New fixtures should be energy efficient, should hi-light specific functional areas, and may be used to visually reinforce the path of travel to the main sanctuary.
- Provide a new welcome station sized to meet functional ministry needs (large enough but not oversized), strategically for good exposure and as a supporting element of the flow of people to and from the sanctuary.
- 4 Remove walls of classroom two common to the foyer including bulkheads (as much as possible) that were previously used to support folding partitions. Work with the BCS/EBFC Liaison to provide meeting areas for functions previously located in classroom two, and as directed by the elders and deacons
- 5 Provide new furnishings including;

Welcome center

Signage

Table display space for use by ministries Wall display areas (bulletin boards)

Sign up areas

Missions display

Secret sister area

Seating for waiting and conversation

# POD (Pastor of Discipleship) Report, Aug/Sep 2015

As I wrapped up the book of Job, I marveled at the work of God in the face of tragedy. As Job endured the seemingly undeserved anguish of losing everything including his health, then having to listen to the self-righteous rhetoric of his so-called friends giving him the bullet points as to why this happened to him, it astounded me that God never explained to Job what was going on. Instead, he leads Job in a series of unanswerable questions with regard to how big, awesome, and sovereign He is. At the end, here's how Job responds:

"Then Job answered the Lord and said: "Behold, I am of small account; what shall I answer you? I lay my hand on my mouth. I have spoken once, and I will not answer; twice, but I will proceed no further."" (Job 40:3–5, ESV)

""I know that you can do all things, and that no purpose of yours can be thwarted." (Job 42:2, ESV)

"I had heard of you by the hearing of the ear, but now my eye sees you;" (Job 42:5, ESV)

"therefore I despise myself, and repent in dust and ashes."" (Job 42:6, ESV)

His response transcends human logic as to why we think stuff happens to us...it is because God's purpose is beyond our scope of understanding, it cannot be thwarted, it deserves no explanation, it allows us to see God from "above the sun", and helps us to see who we are and what we deserve thus bring about repentance and holiness.

"Lord, help me to accept your will for my life irregardless if it makes sense to me or not, Amen."

With that in mind, here is a quick summary of some of the ministry opportunities from August/September 2015:

# **Kids Crossing**

- Cross Time Sunday School: Praise the Lord for the full complement of teachers he has given us! Charity Roth has stepped up to teach the 4 yr-K class; Odd months, as Becky Masessa got married and moved away. Our current study is about "God the Creator".
- **Early Childhood (2&3 year-olds):** Continuing to go well for both services and Sunday School. Praise the Lord, all teaching positions are filled.
- Children's Church: The Gospel Project curriculum worship segment continues to work well for Children's Church. We continue to see between 8-12 students each week.
- Wednesday Evening Programs: Our Awana program preparations are in full swing for a new season beginning September 16. We conducted our volunteer training event on September 9 with about 20 in attendance. We are currently working on a new computer based registration for the participants...we hope to roll this out in the next month. Please pray for Julie Gibson in her role as Awana commander as the Lissy's have stepped down to work in the Youth Ministry.
- New PA Background Check Requirements for Employees & Volunteers: We are 100% complete with the new PA Background Check Requirements for volunteers with good cooperation from everyone. Since the deadline has come and gone, no person 18 yrs or older can serve without their background checks completed. The good news is that from here on out, the cost is free for volunteers, and it only has to be done every 5 years! There are still a number of volunteers who have not completed the Mandatory Reporter Training, though not required to serve.

# Worship Team Discipleship
